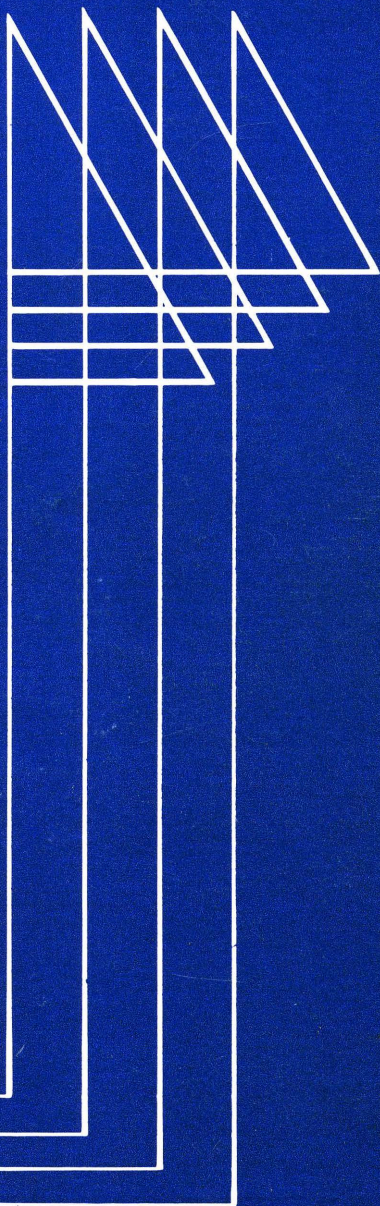

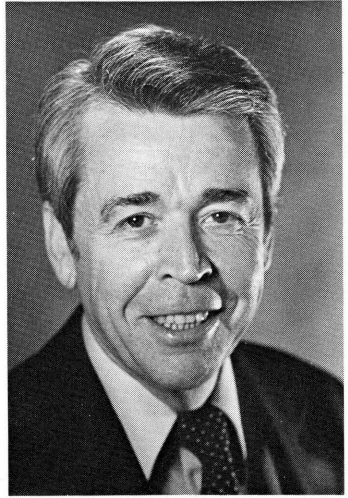

Commencement Address*



The Commencement Address today will be delivered by the Honorable James R. Harris, who has distinguished himself in the fields of business, geology, and government service.

Earlier this year, President Ronald Reagan nominated him as Director of the United States Office of Surface Mining and Reclamation in the Department of the Interior. He is well prepared to assume the responsibilities of this federal office. As a high school and college student, he worked for a coal mine to defray education expenses. He also was a coal mine superintendent for a short time. In 1951, he earned the Bachelor of Arts degree from Indiana University in geology, and after serving as an officer in the U.S. Navy during the Korean conflict, returned to his native southwestern Indiana to work as a consulting geologist and oil producer.

Senator Harris has a special commitment to improved educational opportunities for young people. He was elected to the Warrick County School Board in 1962 and served as its president for six years. For 13 years, he was President and co-owner of the Elberfeld Telephone Company.

He was first elected to the Indiana Legislature in 1972 as a member of the

House of Representatives. In 1976, he was elected to the Indiana Senate and re-elected in 1980. During his first term in the Senate, his colleagues chose him "Outstanding Republican Freshman Senator". His committee work in the Senate reflects his interest in natural resources and environmental affairs. He has served as chairman of the Senate Standing Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment; the Interim Committee on Surface Mining; and the Natural Resources Advisory Committee. He also has been a member of the Senate Finance Committee.

His potential for leadership in public service was demonstrated early. In 1947, he served as Governor of Hoosier Boys' State and as Indiana representative to Boys' Nation in Washington, D.C. That was the same year he met Jesslyn R. Ball, Governor of Hoosier Girls' State, who would become his bride six years later. Today, they are the parents of four sons.

In recognition of his many contributions to the people of southwestern Indiana, Senator Harris will receive the honorary Doctor of Civil Laws degree in today's ceremony.

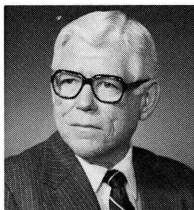

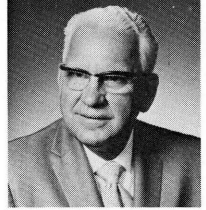

Mr. Couch is Associate Dean for Counseling and Assistant Professor of Education Emeritus at ISUE. As the University's first counselor, he drew on his 43 years of prior experience in teaching and counseling to assist students with their emotional, academic and career problems. Mr. Couch earned the Bachelor of Science degree from Central Normal College and the Master of Science degree from Indiana University. Prior to joining ISUE, he had spent 25 years as guidance counselor at Bosse High School and had taught and coached in Patriot and Jamestown, Indiana; on an Indian reservation in Isabel, South Dakota; and at Indiana University.

In addition to her business interests, she has directed much of her energy toward civic and philanthropic work. She is a member of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the Deaconess Hospital Foundation and is a life member of the Deaconess Auxiliary. Through her work with Sigma Alpha sorority, she has helped to further nursing education interests at Deaconess Hospital. Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.
