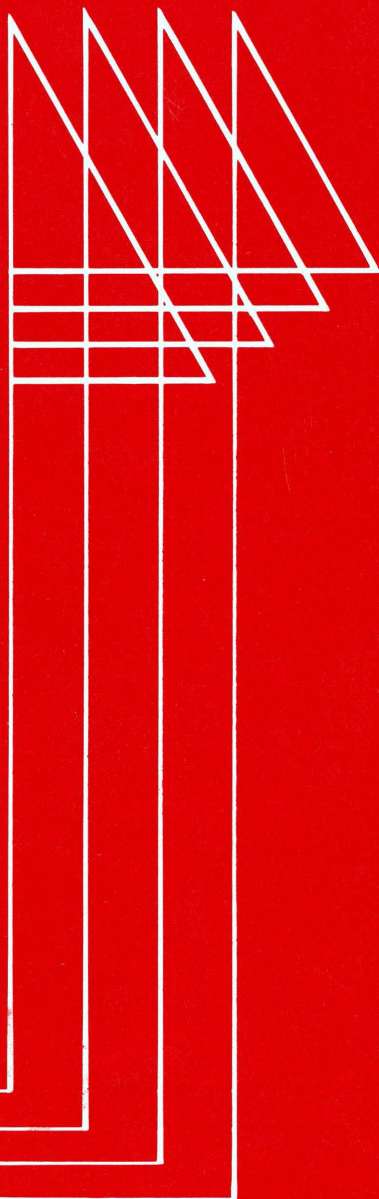

Bishop Francis R. Shea Will Deliver Commencement Address

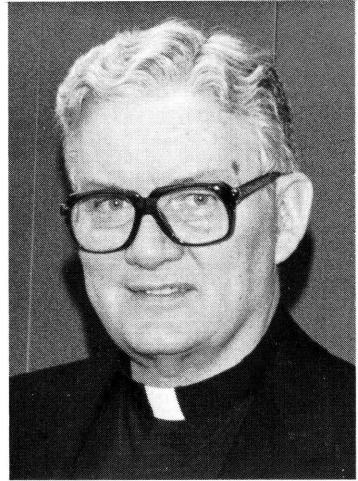
The Commencement Address today will be delivered by the Most Reverend Francis R. Shea, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Evansville. During his episcopacy, Bishop Shea has shown great concern for education and for planning for the future of young people in the community.

A native of Knoxville, Tennessee, Reverend Shea was educated at the Holy Ghost Elementary School, then prepared for the priesthood at St. Charles College and St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland, where he was awarded the Bachelor of Arts degree. He attended the Gregorian University in Rome, Italy, while a student in the North American College. He earned the Bachelor of Divinity degree and was ordained in 1939.

From 1939 to 1945, Reverend Shea served in Memphis, Tennessee. He pursued further education at Peabody College in Nashville and was awarded the Master of Arts degree in education. As a young priest, Reverend Shea taught philosophy and religion for two years at Christian Brothers College in Memphis before joining the faculty of Siena College for girls in the same city.

Reverend Shea was instrumental in the establishment of Memphis Catholic High School. Shortly after its founding, Reverend Shea was named principal of Father Ryan High School in Nashville, filling a vacancy created when the former principal went to Memphis Catholic. He served as principal for eleven years before returning to his native Knoxville as pastor of Immaculate Conception Church in 1956.

His church, a downtown parish, gave him new opportunities to continue his interest in education since the area had one high school and several elementary schools. During this time, he served as a member of the diocesan board of educa-



tion, a member of the diocesan theology commission, and as a diocesan consultant. He saw to the needs of the schools and aided in fundraising for capital projects. It was also during this time that he became involved in community affairs, working for the United Fund and on several civic boards in Knoxville.

In December, 1969, Pope Paul VI announced Reverend Shea's appointment as Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Evansville. He was ordained as the third bishop of Evansville's Diocese on February 3, 1970. At the time of his ordination, he was awarded the honorary Doctor of Divinity degree.

In the thirteen years he has led the Evansville Diocese, he has become known for his concern for young people, for justice and peace, and for the sacredness of life and of the family. The Evansville Diocese includes 12 southwestern Indiana counties with 74 parishes serving 90,000 Catholics.

Reverend Shea's church responsibilities reach beyond his diocesan work. He has served on the Administrative Committee of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and Administrative Board of the U.S. Catholic Conference for seven years, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Indiana Catholic Conference.

The honorary Doctor of Humane Letters will be conferred on Bishop Shea in today's ceremony.

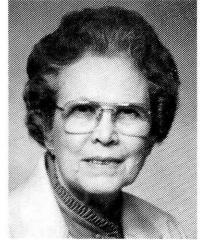

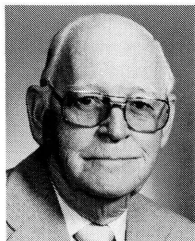

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.
