The 1974 Commencement address will be given by Sylvia F. Porter. Miss Porter is a nationally syndicated daily columnist. Her column on economics and related subjects, which appears locally in the Evansville Press, is syndicated in more than 350 newspapers in the United States and outside the United States.

Recognized as an authority on United States Government finance, Sylvia Porter also edits a weekly newsletter, "Reporting on Governments." The newsletter is devoted to developments in Government finance, the bond and money markets, and the economic outlook. It is subscribed to by banks and financial institutions from coast to coast.

Critics acclaim Miss Porter's writing talents. Miss Porter authored and co-authored several books, and is a recognized authority on income tax. Sylvia Porter's Income Tax Guide has been published annually since 1960. The Journal of Home Economics applauds her "ability to find the economic stories of the day and to take these stories to the public." The San Francisco Chronicle says "Sylvia Porter . . . is wise and comforting without being arch."

Miss Porter, born in Patchogue, L.I., New York, was graduated from Hunter College, magna cum laude in 1932. She also studied at the Graduate School of Business Administration of New York University.

Cited for numerous awards for outstanding work in journalism, Miss Porter was named "Outstanding Woman of the Year" for 1960 by Who's Who of American Women; named Free Enterprise Writer of the Year by the National Management Association in 1966; received a Top Hat award from the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc. in 1967; named Woman of the Year in Communications for 1970 by the Advertising Club of New York, and was elected to the Hall of Fame of the Alumni Association of Hunter College in 1973.

Commenting on Miss Porter being selected as the 1974 Commencement speaker, ISUE President David Rice explains, "Miss Porter has continuously advised youth to take advantage of educational opportunities in times when others have been spreading messages of doubt. Her comments to members of the class of 1974 will be positive as they set forth to develop their career goals."

Sylvia Porter is married to G. Sumner Collins, General Promotion Director of the Hearst Newspapers, and has a daughter, Cris. Miss Porter is listed in "Who's Who." Currently she holds honorary degrees from ten institutions of higher education. Her most recent degree was an honorary Doctor of Letters degree from Allegheny College in Meadville, Pennsylvania. She will be receiving the degree, Doctor of Letters, from Indiana State University during the Commencement exercises today.

Mr. Woods received the American Druggist Citation for outstanding community service as a civic leader and pharmacist in 1948. He has served as vice-president of the National Association of Chain Drug Stores, and past president of the Southern Drug Store Association. Mr. Woods received the Rotary Club's outstanding citizens award in 1952 for his work with the Community Fund, Evansville Committee of One Hundred, the Red Cross, and the United Service Organization. Mr. Woods will be receiving a Doctor of Laws degree.

In Memory of ISU Board President

John McCutchan, 1915 – 1974

Indiana State University suffered a tragic loss this academic year, with the untimely death of its Board of Trustees President John McCutchan. Mr. McCutchan had been a member of the Board of Trustees since 1967 and had an effective and distinguished career as a member of the Board. At the February, 1974 meeting of the Indiana State University Board of Trustees a resolution was passed in the memory of John McCutchan. That resolution follows:

“That the Board of Trustees of Indiana State University go on record here as expressing their tribute to John E. McCutchan and their sense of real loss at his passing. John came on our Board in 1967 and from that day forward has participated fully and actively as a Board Member in the administration in the affairs of Indiana State University. His interest and enthusiasm were recognized by his election to the Presidency of the Board in the year 1970 and again recognized in his re-election as President of the Board in July of 1973. At the time of his death he was serving as President of our Board of Trustees. He was a member who always did his homework. His knowledge and opinions on affairs of Indiana State University were well documented and researched. His concern of the welfare and future of Indiana State University was always apparent in his willingness to devote his time and energy to the investigation and solutions of the many problems presenting themselves. He presided over Board meetings with great ability, fairness and equity and all of his activities were tinged with a delightful and sophisticated sense of humor. His presence and influence on the affairs of Indiana State University will be long remembered and sorely missed.”



Offering Students Quality Education

Indiana State University Evansville, in its ninth year, serves a student population of just under 3,000 students, and has an 83 member faculty. Offering programs in six academic areas, Indiana State University Evansville has 25 major degree programs, 39 minor programs, and 6 associate degree programs. The university has awarded 775 baccalaureate degrees and 40 associate degrees, with 450 degrees to be conferred this year.

Described as a youthful faculty in chronological age, 50.6% of the ISUE faculty have doctoral degrees. Seventy percent of the total faculty are natives of the north-central United States, with 33 percent from Indiana. Both the faculty diversity and regional orientations help faculty members to understand the background, needs and desires of the local student constituency.¹

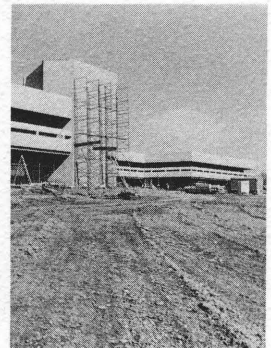
The majority of the ISUE student body is male. About 3/4 of the students work while attending the university, and more than 1/3 of these students pay their college expense themselves. Over 98% of the student body is from Indiana. The academic excellence of the students is reflected in the semester honors program. 12% of the students are named to the Dean's List. To be named to the Dean's List students must have a grade point average 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 grading system.

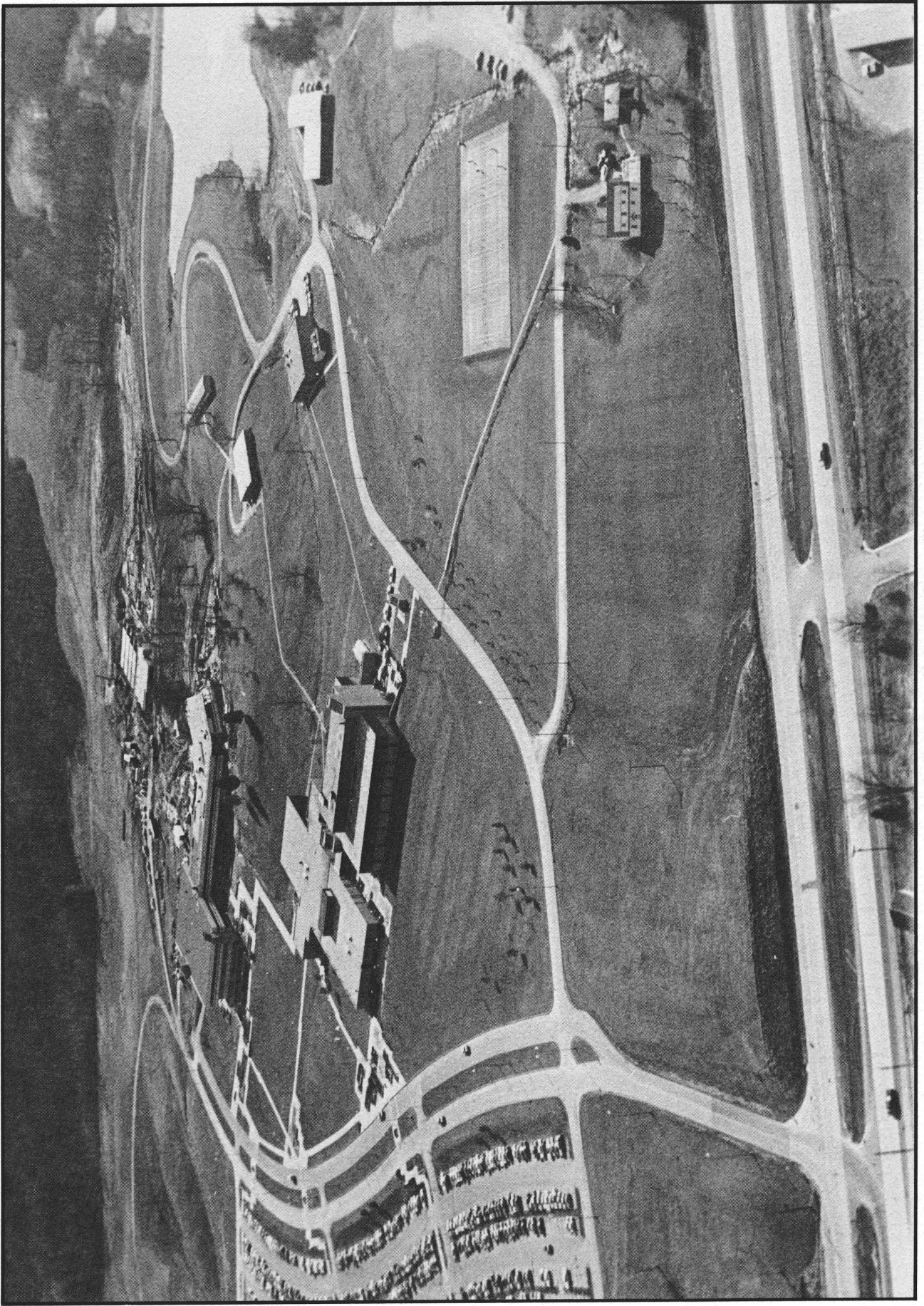
Student organizations at ISUE, which number over 30, serve the social, academic, political, and special activity interests of the students. The ISUE Student Government Association and Student Union Board coordinate the student activities and student concerns through the Dean of Students Office.

Located at mid point between the metropolitan areas of Evansville and Mt. Vernon, Indiana State University Evansville has 300 acres of beautiful Southern Indiana countryside amidst rolling hills and colorful wooded areas. The University has been developed in the 1400-acre Mid America University Center complex purchased by community citizens through Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. The natural area of the campus is maintained as new buildings are constructed. The newest campus structure, the University Center, is built into a hill mass in the center of campus.

Indiana State University Evansville affords educational opportunity to high school graduates who are of good character and who have reasonable chance of success. Its mission provides for the student's personal and social needs as well as the promotion of each student's intellectual development in harmony with his level of ability.
