

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Scope and Methodology

This report includes data about the December 2013, May 2014, June 2014, July 2014, and August 2014 University of Southern Indiana undergraduate and graduate degree recipients. This study utilizes data from 43% of all Bachelor's degree and Associate's degree recipients and 34% of all advanced degree recipients. Data was collected via graduation fair surveys, online surveys, telephone and email solicitations, alumni records, social media research, and input from faculty, staff, and employers. Data collection began in January 2015 and concluded in April 2015.

Placement and Knowledge Rate

The University of Southern Indiana placement rate for the 2014 undergraduate graduating class is 89%. The term "placement rate" is calculated by dividing the number of students who are employed, continuing their education, or pursuing neither of those options after graduation by the total number of students about whom we have information. We successfully contacted, surveyed, and/or researched 816 of those graduates which resulted in a 41% knowledge rate. The term "knowledge rate" defines the percent of graduates for which we have reasonable and verifiable information concerning the graduates' post-graduation career activities. This knowledge rate is considerably lower than the proposed national minimum knowledge rate of 65%.

Students

Fifty-nine percent of this graduating class used the services of the Career Services and Internships office while attending the University of Southern Indiana.

Employers

Bachelor's degree graduates were employed with 412 different employers in 28 states and 5 countries. The diversity found within this group is a benefit for our students.

THE CLASS OF 2014

PROFILE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR

The Office of the Registrar reports the following demographic information regarding the Class of 2014. It is included to provide a useful background for other data contained in this report.

- Between December 2013 and August 2014, 2,012 degrees and certificates were awarded to 1,977 individuals.
- A total of 1,581 baccalaureate degrees were awarded as follows: 1,131 Bachelor of Science; 151 Bachelor of Arts; 60 Bachelor of Social Work; 186 Bachelor of Science in Nursing; 15 Bachelor of General Studies; and 38 Bachelor of Science in Engineering.
- Among the graduates, 90 percent identified themselves as white, non-Hispanic; 7 percent of the graduates classified themselves as minorities; and 1 percent did not specify.
- Among the graduates, 66 percent were female, a 2 percent decrease from 2013.
- 48 percent of the graduates were from Gibson, Posey, Vanderburgh, or Warrick counties. Graduates from all other counties in Indiana represented 20 percent of the graduating class; 15 percent of the degree recipients were from other states; and 1 percent were from other countries.
- Baccalaureate degrees were awarded by the College of Liberal Arts (30 percent); Romain College of Business (20 percent); College of Nursing and Health Professions (28 percent); Pott College of Science, Engineering and Education (18 percent); and Outreach and Engagement (.9 percent).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY / FOLLOW-UP SURVEY

This report is a six-month follow-up of the 2013-2014 graduating class; responses were received from 41 percent of the graduates.

EMPLOYMENT RATES

- 89.5% percent of respondents are employed, an increase of 6.7 percent from 2013; 77.9 percent of employed respondents are full-time, 9.2 percent of employed respondents are part-time. 11.8 percent of employed respondents are still seeking.
- There were only 25 unemployed bachelor graduates not working and not enrolled in additional coursework or attending graduate school that were actively seeking employment. 50 percent of unemployed respondents are either enrolled in additional academic coursework or have chosen not to seek employment at this time. 39.5 percent of unemployed respondents are actively seeking employment. 10 percent of respondents are unemployed.
- Of the graduates who are employed full time, 53 percent have secured new positions with a new employer, 10.7 percent have secured new positions with the same employer and 23.8 percent are employed in the same position they held prior to graduation.

• Among bachelor degree recipients who are full time employed, 71.8 percent are working "in their field or in a field in which they expressed satisfaction." (Education majors employed as substitute teachers are coded as working "in their field".)

CONTINUED EDUCATION

- Among bachelor degree recipients who responded to the survey, 12.9 percent were attending graduate school within a year of graduation.
- Among associate degree recipients, 12.5 percent are currently completing requirements for a baccalaureate degree.
- Among bachelor degree recipients, 2.9 percent are enrolled in additional undergraduate coursework.

SALARY STATISTICS

- The average starting salary for baccalaureate degree graduates securing NEW, FULL-TIME POSITIONS was \$44,160, a 21 percent increase over the average starting salary of \$35,930 in 2013.
- The average starting salary for associate degree graduates securing NEW, FULL-TIME POSITIONS was \$48,020, an increase of 14.9 percent from the average starting salary of \$37,056 in 2013.

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION

• Among those that responded to the survey that are employed graduates, 73.9 percent accepted employment within the tri-state (a 60-mile radius of the University). Fifty-eight of these individuals reside in Kentucky or Illinois.
