

SEXUAL ASSAULT NURSE EXAMINER

A SANE is a registered nurse who has received advanced education and training regarding sexual assault and forensic nursing. SANE-trained nurses must follow specific protocols in the care and examination of sexual assault victims to preserve evidence and ensure chain of custody. SANEs complete a medical forensic examination, collect and preserve specimens, apply critical thinking skills and are considered expert witnesses in the judicial system.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Recognizing the importance of participation across different agencies, SANE Training is appropriate for nurses, law enforcement, advocates, prosecutors, healthcare professionals, students and social workers.

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS

Instructors include SANE-trained and SANE-certified nurses, clinical experts, Indiana State Police forensic scientists, prosecuting attorneys and victim support specialists.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This training will follow the 64-hour 2018 International Association of Forensic Nurses education guidelines for the Adult/Adolescent/Pediatric Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE). To sit for the SANE certification exam, a nurse must complete the entire SANE Training (self-study plus five-day training), as well as clinical requirements outlined by the International Association of Forensic Nurses, which will be discussed during the training.

SELF-STUDY PRIOR TO TRAINING

Nurses enrolled in the five-day SANE Training must complete a 24-hour online education module prior to the training. Access to online instruction materials will be provided to nurses. Submission of online materials is required by March 1, prior to attendance at the training starting on March 4.
